ORDER VACATING STANDING ORDER 20-10 AND REOPENING PUBLIC AREAS OF THE CLERK'S OFFICE EFFECTIVE JUNE 14, 2021

On March 27, 2020, this Court entered Standing Order 20-10, which closed the public areas of the Clerk's Office in all divisions due to the outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in the United States and the Commonwealth of Virginia. Standing Order 20-10 became effective on March 30, 2020, until further notice. Contemporaneously with the entry of Standing Order 20-10, the Court also entered Standing Order 20-9, which implemented temporary filing procedures to accommodate unrepresented parties, which include filing by mail, lock box, and email. *See* Standing Order 20-9 and Standing Order 20-19, which incorporated by reference Standing Order 20-9, as Exhibit A thereto, thereby extending the original Order's May 31, 2020, expiration date, until further notice.

In consideration of the significant, recent improvements in conditions in the Commonwealth of Virginia with respect to COVID-19, the Court has determined that, barring

¹As of the date of this Standing Order, approximately 8.5 million doses of the COVID-19 vaccine have been administered in the Commonwealth and almost half of the population is fully vaccinated. Further, as of the date of this Standing Order, the seven-day percent positivity rate for PCR COVID-19 tests was just 2.1 percent. See Va. The number of cases of COVID-19 in the Commonwealth is continuing on a downward trend, and the seven-day moving average of cases is at a low not seen since the beginning of the pandemic. See Va. These improvements, along with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, have led the Governor of Virginia to begin lifting COVID-19 mitigation measures. any material change in circumstances, it is now appropriate to reopen the public areas of the Clerk's Office to again provide in-person service to members of the public.

Accordingly, it is hereby ORDERED that **effective on June 14, 2021**, Standing Order 20-10 is VACATED and the public areas of the Clerk's Office in the Alexandria, Newport News, Norfolk, and Richmond Divisions of the Court will reopen to the public.
